


August 2006 Tiny Treat – Filled Jar

Background (Top and Corners) – Beige on Beige
Cut 6 – 1 ½ inch squares



Jar Lid – Brown, Gold or Gray
Cut 1 – 1 ½ x 3 ½ inch rectangle

Jar Contents – Anything that you might find in a jar
(Buttons, fruits, vegetables, insects, etc.)
Cut 1 – 5 ½ x 7 ½ inch rectangle


To Assemble – Use 4 of the 1 ½ inch background squares for the corners of the jar. (Snowball technique – draw a line from corner to corner on the 4 squares. Using the line as a guide – stitch with the side of the needle touching the outside edge of the line. Cut the excess fabric leaving a ¼ inch seam.)

Sew a 1 ½ inch background square to each side of the jar lid. Connect the lid to the jar as illustrated.

Finished block size 5 x 8

September 2006 Tiny Treat – Maple Leaf in the Fall

Background – Cream Tone on Tone
Cut 1 – 3 ½ inch Square
Cut 2 – 3 7/8 inch Squares for Half Square Triangle Units or use 3 inch finished thangles – need 2 units.
Cut 1 – 3 7/8 inch square for stem unit – cut on diagonal once for 2 triangles.



Leaf and Stem – Fall Colors Your Choice
Cut 2 – 3 7/8 inch Squares for Half Square Triangle Units or use 3 inch finished thangles – need 2 units.
Cut 3 – 3 ½ inch squares
Cut 1 Stem – 1 1/8 x 6 inch rectangle

Assemble – complete the half square triangles using the background and leaf fabric. To complete the stem section stitch the background fabric triangles to both sides of the stem fabric – trim to a 3 ½ inch square. Assemble as illustrated.

Finished block size 9 x 9

Quilting "For the Cure"


