President's Block

As a tribute and thank you to each CCQG Board President, guild members are asked to make an Ohio Star block in the president's choice of colors. 2011-12 President Jean Kaufmann has chosen a three-color scheme: primary yellow, black, and white, in any combination. The block size should be 10 1/2" finished, 11" unfinished.

Please sign your block, bring it to guild and leave it at the Vice President's table.







FINISHED BLOCK SIZE Single dimensions in the cutting chart indicate the size of the cut square (3" = 3" x 3"). FOR 1 BLOCK: 101/2" hio Star A: 2 ⊠→⊠ 43/4" Light B: 4 🗌 4" PRESIDENT'S BLOCK C: 2 ⊠→⊠ 43/4" Dark For Jean Kaufmann D: 1 [4" 10 1/2" block in primary yellow and/or black and/or white

For (A) and (D): Light Value Scraps For (B) and (C): Dark Value Scraps

From <u>each</u> of the four colors:

1) Cut one rectangle 2 ¹/₂" by 12 ¹/₂"

2) Cut three squares 2 ¹/₂" by 2 ¹/₂"

Then:

3) Join alternate (A) and (B) squares to make a rectangle with square (A) on the bottom.

4) Join the (A) rectangle to the left edge of the squares and the (B) rectangle to the right edge of the squares.

5) Join alternate (C) and (D) squares to make a rectangle with square (C) on the bottom.

6) Join the (C) rectangle to the left edge of the squares and the (D) rectangle to the right edge of the squares.

7) Join the units as shown to make the block.

8) In the quilt, blocks can be set alternating the horizontal and vertical rows.

Fat Chance Themes for 2011-2012 *Famous Sayings*

March 2012 "A Stitch in Time Saves Nine" ~ Sewing machines, notions, thread, etc.

April 2012 "It's Raining Cats and Dogs" ~ **Cats and/or Dogs**

May TINY TREATS Dimensional Flying Geese 10" finished / 10 ½" unfinished



For (A): Scrappy Pastel Flower Colors For (B): Scrappy Pale Greens

1) Cut two 3" squares from each (B) fabric for a total of sixteen squares.

2) Cut one 5 ¹/₂" by 3" rectangle from each color of (A) for a total of eight rectangles.

3) Fold each (A) rectangle in half, wrong sides together. You should end up with a folded piece of fabric that is 2 ³/₄" by 3".

4) Place the folded (A) rectangle onto the right side of one 3" square. Align only the lower corners. The folded edge of the goose fabric should be UP and the two raw edges should be down.

5) Cover this stack with the other background square, all right sides together, and sew along one side using a ¼" seam. You may sew on either edge, just be sure that the folded edge of the (A) is UP, between the layers of the background fabric.

6) Open and press the (A) fabric open. Be careful to press each (A) fabric evenly, as this is a secret to creating perfect geese. Your pressed triangle/'goose' should look balanced from side to side.

7) You will find that you have the right ¼" seam allowance already built into the top of the patch, and that as you sew the geese together into rows, the outside and bottom seam allowances give perfect points!

8) Join four of the geese units in a vertical row with the points facing up.

9) Join four of the geese units in a vertical row with the points facing down.
