Bereavement Quilts

Here is additional information from the Sparrow Volunteer Services Coordinator, Tracy Feazel, regarding the bereavement quilts they are requesting. If you have additional questions contact me (371-4032) or Tracy (364-7178). Reminder: the quilts are to be 24"x24".

- 1. The backing needs to be 100% cotton in solid white or beige or a very light color so the child's hand and foot prints will be absorbed and seen easily.
- 2. The quilts can be whatever the quilter wants to make so long as it is not drab or dreary. Sparrow will try to match a quilt to a child, ie. if a child liked to play baseball, they will give the child a quilt with baseball-type fabric; or if a child's favorite color was pink, they will try to match that. Just keep in mind something appropriate for a child.
- 3. The quilts can be pieced or just big squares sewn together or strips; again it's the quilter's preference.
- $4. \ \,$ The quilts can be quilted or tied or tacked together, whatever the quilter wants to do.

Sparrow said basically what we've been donating for Heartwarmers would be appropriate; so just do what you've been doing in the past.




Kitty Corner Unit

Needed: 2 - light 5" squares and 2-dark 5" squares: also 8- light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 8-dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Cut each 5" square in half, creating 8- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" pieces. Mark a diagonal line on each of the small squares. Place a light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on opposite corners of a dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" piece. Sew across diagonal marks, press open and trim away underneath corners. Repeat process using light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on dark pieces and dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on light pieces. Bring 8 total $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" units.



February Flying Geese Unit

Needed: 2 - light 5" squares and 2-dark 5" squares: also 8- light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 8-dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. The beginning measurement is a bit different this month so heads up. Cut the 5" squares in half and trim them to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ". Mark a diagonal line on each of the small squares. Place a light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on a corner of a dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " piece. Sew across diagonal mark, press open, and cut away underneath corner. Repeat the process on the opposite corner. This should produce a perfect flying goose (or is it really geese?) unit. Continue making units using dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces and $2\frac{1}{2}$ " light squares on dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces. Bring all 8.


