





UNITS

March: Combo Unit

Needed: 5 - light 5" squares and 5-dark 5" squares also 10 additional 4½" squares of different fabrics. Mark a diagonal line on each light square. With right sides together, place one dark and one light square together. Sew ½" on either side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line. You now have 10 half- square triangles. Square these to 4½", mark a diagonal line on each half-square triangle, and place each on one of the additional 4½" squares. Sew ½" on either side of the diagonal line and cut on the line. Square these units to 4". There will be 20 units. Someone will get bunches and bunches of combo units.



April: Shaded Half-Square Triangle

Needed: 10-light 5" squares and 10-dark 5" squares and 10-light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and 10-dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Mark a diagonal line on each of the 20 small squares. Using 5 dark squares, place a light $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on opposite corners of a dark 5" square. Sew across the diagonal marks. Press the resulting corners open. Cut away the underneath corner. Square to 5" x 5". Do the same with dark $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares on 5 light 5" squares .Mark a diagonal line on each additional light and dark 5" pieces. Place a corner-pieced unit with light corners on a light 5" square. Sew $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the diagonal line, cut on the diagonal line, iron, and square to $\frac{4}{2}$ ". Repeat process using light corner-pieced units with light 5" squares and dark corner- pieced units with dark 5" squares. Bring all 20 for a great chance to win a lot of units.
