Capitol City Quilt Guild, Quilt Challenge for 2015

Your challenge theme this year is titled "Celestial Bodies".

The American Quilt Society (AQS) has a contest each year at their regional shows called The Ultimate Guild Challenge. This year the deadline for submission of our guild's 8 favorite entries is earlier than previous years....so get YOUR quilt finished for the February 2015 Guild meeting. The size needs to be as follows:

WIDTH: minimum 30 inches, maximum 60 inches.

LENGTH: 30 inches or more.

So the smallest quilt you may enter is 30x30 inches square. But it doesn't have to be a square! Let your inspiration and creativity run free! Your quilt may be traditional, modern, an art quilt...anything that fits the size requirements and has been quilted by hand or machine (no tied quilts). The "Celestial Bodies" theme must be reflected in the pattern (Mariner's Compass to nine-patch stars...it's all okay) AND/OR the fabrics used. Spaceships & UFO's? Christmas wall-hanging with the guiding star? A baby quilt with some star fabrics? It's all good! We will be voting on "most creative", "best use of color", "best interpretation of theme" and "my favorite for no particular reason". And we will have participation prizes to be announced at the December meeting! The top 8 vote-getters will be entered in the AQS Guild Challenge for the 2015 Grand Rapids show.

I am so excited to try my hand at this... Last year we did not get enough entries to submit...this year we are going to SHINE !
