If we choose to enter the AQS Guild Challenge, the size requirements are 30-60 inches wide and at least 30 inches long.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

At the July Guild meeting, I brought up a situation that I was apprised of regarding a rumor that was going around about the Board moving their monthly Board meeting from Gall Sewing Center to Country Stitches and the fact that members were not going to frequent Gall's in the future.

First of all, rumors can be very harmful, especially when all of the facts are not known. So, I want to straighten the situation out and tell you how generous Jason of Gall Sewing is being to the Guild members.

The Board moved from Country Stitches because the classroom we were meeting in was not going to be available the second Thursday of each month. At that point, it is my understanding that Gall offered to allow the Board to hold our meetings at their location in Frandor and offered us a discount on anything we purchased the day of the Board meeting. Not only that, but because they were not open when our Board meetings took place, they paid to have an employee on duty to assist us, at no charge to us. Furthermore, they did not charge us for the use of their facility. They bent over backwards to assist us in anything we needed.

This year, the Board decided to move back to Country Stitches as our Board meeting night was available and we would have a larger area to meet. I have been assured by Ann at Country Stitches that there should not be a conflict in the future. This was also at no charge.

I called Jason at Gall's and apologized for this rumor and said that I would mention it at our meeting and write about the "rumor" in the newsletter. Jason told me that he understood and he offered any Guild member 25% discount on the third Thursday of each month for any member that wanted to stop by for fabric, etc.

So, please frequent both businesses as we need to keep our local quilt shops in the area providing to our needs as quilters. We also get a 10% discount at Country Stitches and they will add the full total (minus tax) to our blue cards, which gives us a 20% discount anytime we want to purchase at their stores simply by stating that you are a Capitol City Quilt Guild member.

If you hear any rumors or have any questions about business or other items pertaining to the Guild, please do not hesitate to contact either me or one of the Board members. Rumors can be hurtful for individuals and especially for businesses.


