The Teal Quilt Project

Comfort, heal, advocate, and educate through community-participatory art

Time for a Teal Quilt Project Update (the TQP is a partnership between the Capitol City Quilt Guild, Quilting by the River, Small Talk Children's Advocacy Center, Grewal Law, and Country Stitches to make a ~48" x 60" lap quilt for each of the Sister Survivors of Larry Nassar, see

https://www.facebook.com/groups/tealquiltproject/ for details).

As of July 30, we have a total of 352 finished quilts (167 quilts were delivered to the Grewal Law Offices for distribution), 8 quilts being bound, 25 quilts being quilted, and 19 tops with backs. Once all are finished the total is 404!! Thank you everyone who contributed or just cheered us on. Distribution has slowed down, so we will be adding other attorneys and groups that can help us get the guilts in the hands of the Sister Survivors. We have exceeded our first goal of 350 quilts, so are not pursuing new donations. If you have a finished quilt, we will still accept it, but we are not accepting tops, blocks, or fabrics. Our biggest need is for a few long-arm quilters to take some of the 19 tops and backs. You can send me an email at tealquiltproject@gmail.com if you're willing to help us get these last tops guilted. (I can provide and attach the binding.) As always, quilts can be dropped off at Country Stitches any time or given to me at a CCQG meeting.

So a sincere thank you to all the members who made this project a rousing success. The Teal Quilt Project wouldn't be happening without you.
