I'm usually working on one or more quilt projects at a time and enjoy every minute of it! I'm looking forward to seeing all of you again as we resume guild activities."



Linda Wells chose to show one of her quilt designs. "I don't remember *not* sewing. My mother taught me to sew when I was little and I made clothes for my dolls. When I was in middle school I took Home Ec and walked in my first day wearing clothes I had made from head to toe. I have run my own home sewing business and been the seamstress at an upholstery shop doing all the sewing and pattern development.

My mother-in-law was a quilter and taught quilting. She would cut templates out of cereal boxes, draw around them and add the seam allowance. No rotary cutters then! My sister-in-law also quilted. She helped me and I decided to make a log cabin quilt as that was one of my mother-in-law's favorite patterns. She also believed that a REAL quilt had to be hand quilted, so, in homage to her, I hand quilted the queen size quilt.

I like to do applique, but not a lot :). I like piecing. I do my own machine quilting on most of my quilts, unless they are too large for me to manipulate in my machine. I have quilts hanging on the walls of my house, on the beds, and have made a baby quilt for almost everyone I work with! I do complete some patterns of others, but I also love to create my own patterns.

One summer, my daughter left for college, my son went off to be on staff at Boy Scout camp, hubby worked second shift and I was home alone every evening. I didn't handle this really well. My husband said, "Hey, remember that quilting meeting thing that Mom used to go to, do they still meet? Maybe you should check it out." Well, that was the beginning of my fast and furious slide into being both fabric- and quilt-obsessed! The CCQG was meeting at Waverly Middle School and I went. There was a speaker that night, and I LOVED it! I have been a member ever since. I feel blessed to have met and worked with many of our Guild members. I have such wonderful memories of all the fun meetings and activities. Many of my closest friends are a part of this Guild.

I have co-chaired 3 quilt shows, been Vice President and President, belonged to two different small groups, and have organized 6 years of quilt retreats. I am hoping that VERY soon we can again get together for another wonderful retreat!"

PRESIDENT'S BLOCKS for Cathy Skelton

Cathy has requested that these fabrics be used: Nature fabrics (plants, animals, geology, weather, astronomy, for examples) for the star, and medium to dark green for the background.

Instructions

Cut from background fabric: 4 - 4" squares 2 - 4 3/4" squares. Cut these squares twice diagonally to make 8 quarter square triangles.

Cut from star fabric:

1 - 4" square

2 - 4 3/4" squares. Cut these squares twice diagonally to make 8 quarter square triangles.

Assemble as an Ohio Star block, 11" unfinished, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " finished.
