What is a C-O-I anyway?

In a nutshell, it serves to protect a business from potentially unethical situations. A conflict-of-interest policy is a requirement by the Feds for non-profit status groups to include in their by-laws. It wasn't part of the Guild's original by-laws 40 years ago, as life was simpler then. Since we have to include it now, a formal amendment has to be voted on by the members. This vote is happening in March. The actual policy will be comprehensive, and it is lengthy. The amendment will be a lot shorter. Basically it will state that we HAVE a policy, and that it is readily available for review. Please ask questions if you have them. A similar message, including the actual policy as an attachment, will be sent by email to members.
