PRESIDENT'S BLOCKS

Block Instructions

Cut from your background WHITE fabric (shown in white below):


4 - 41/2" squares

 $2-5 \frac{1}{4}$ " squares to make QST. Make your QST and trim to $4 \frac{1}{2}$ "


Cut from your focus **RED** fabric (shown in green below):

 $1 - 4\frac{1}{2}$ " square $2 - 5\frac{1}{4}$ " squares to make QST. Make your QST and trim to $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Piece like this:



But should look like this:



Block should be 12 1/2" cut. 12" sewn.

MEMBER PROFILE—Jolee Hamlin Jolee is our Program Chair

I developed an interest in quilting well before I began to do it myself. In college, I took several courses which reflected on both quilting specifically and other ways women expressed themselves creatively throughout history. While sewing and quiltmaking were necessary skills for generations upon generations of women, they also were a rare means of conveying creativity, self-expression and artistry – often while 'making do,' or using just what was on hand. At the same time, women in my own family modeled a history of exceptional sewing and quilting skills. My grandmother worked at JCPenney back in the day when they had a 'yard goods' department. She'd bring home fabric time and again, whipping up dresses, skirts, or a new slip cover – all from only a vision in her head, without the benefit of a pattern. My mom took after her, having a glorious knack for garment making. I also had a favorite aunt who used every piece of fabric ever thrown her way to make a new quilted creation or to breathe new life into previously treasured pieces. I knew that someday, I wanted both to develop my own talent and to pay homage to those 'who sewed before me.'

Today, I have been quilting for about 25 years. For the first several years, I only sewed in the summers when I was at my parents' lakeside cottage. There, having a break from the rigmarole of daily life, I would have an extra set of hands to watch my little ones who were pitter pattering about. Nowadays, I seem to dream quilts. Every night, I go to bed, thinking about my current and future projects. I like both the opportunity to create a beautiful quilt with confidence and the opportunity to push myself to continue to develop new skills and expertise. I love the fellowship quilting has afforded me around a shared interest, around which I can enjoy laughter, friendship and encouragement... and SOOO very much talent!
