## 2025 Going to Pieces Quilt Show

Our biennial quilt show was held Friday and Saturday, October 10 and 11, at the Main Arena of the Ingham County Fairgrounds in Mason, Mi. It was a resounding success! We hung around 230 quilts, had challenge quilts from 2025 as well as our guild 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary block challenge quilt on display. 762 attendees visited the show over the two days – up about 50 attendees from 2023. We gave out 10 viewers' choice awards and they were voted as follows:

# PRESIDENT'S BLOCKS Block Instructions

25 patch Checkerboard with Light fabric on all four corners Fabric colors: Light- cream/white and Dark- Navy

Light fabrics (cream/white) - 2 ½" x 32 ½"

Subcut into 3 - 7 ½" x 2 ½"

Subcut into 2 - 5 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Dark Fabric (navy) - 2 1/2" x 30"

Subcut into 2-7 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Subcut into 3-5 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Sew 7 ½ strips long sides together, in alternating colors beginning with Light fabric (Light/Dark/Light/Dark/Light)

Press all seams toward dark

Cross cut into 3 - 2 ½ units (A)

Sew 5 ½ strips long sides together, in alternating colors beginning with Dark fabric (Dark/Light/Dark/Light/Dark)
Press all seams toward dark
Cross cut into 2 - 2 ½ units (B)

### Piece like this:

Sew units together in alternating order (A/B/A/B/A) Remember to have Light fabric in the four corners

### Block should look like this:

Block should be 10 ½" x 10 ½" pieced.

Please sign your block, bring it to the guild meeting and leave it at the Vice President's table.
